Extension of existing Increasing Access service providers via variation until 2023/24 through repurposed Drug and Alcohol Treatment Services Maintenance (DATSM) funding to continue to support AOD priorities identified in our Needs Assessment and in line with the Drug and Alcohol Treatment Activities schedule.

DATSM funding replaced funding previously provided through the Social and Community Services (SACS) Wages Supplementation payments to Alcohol and other Drugs service providers, by the Commonwealth Department for Health and Aged Care.

Description of Activity *

The Increasing Access to Drug and Alcohol Treatment Services in Regional, Rural and Remote Areas activity was delivered from May 2020 to 30 June 2022. Commissioned Service Providers (CSP) were directly approached based on experience in specified areas of need and ability to provide services in remote regions. This funding ceased on 30 June 2021, with activity extended to June 30 2023 through approved underspends and carryovers.

In May 2022, CSAPHN received DOV 3 for Drug and Alcohol Treatment Activities, that includes Drug and Alcohol Treatment Services Maintenance (DATSM) funding from 31 March 2022 through to 30 June 2023.

CSAPHN decommissioned previously eligible SACS service providers prior to 1 July 2021 as part of the AOD Treatment Services RFT. As a result, DATSM funding can be repurposed to support other AOD priorities identified in our Needs Assessment and in line with the Drug and Alcohol Treatment Activities schedule.

In July 2022, CSAPHN received DOV 4, this did not contain DATSM funding extension.

In November 2023, CSAPHN received DOV 5 extending funding for DATSM to 30 June 2024 and commissioned existing DATSM (old SACS) service providers.
